In-Water Winter Storage - We are using the docks on Springer's Wharf this year which means we can handle longer boats up to 45'. If you're interested in our In-Water Winter Storage for this winter, contact Doug NOW!

2026 dock contracts were emailed out on Oct. 17. If you didn't receive yours, please check your spam folder and go through the emails you received that day to be sure you didn't. Then, contact me by email to request a resend. We need your current email address to ensure it doesn't get lost. We are still working to update our database with email corrections. If you did not receive your contract or I'm working on getting you a new one, you will have 30 days additional to return it with your payment.

Please Note! Contract and insurance forms required for winter and spring dockage. Many members are Dead Last when it comes to sending their filled out contracts and proof of insurance forms. This year, we require those forms to be received by the Sadler Board prior to bringing your boat into the marina. There will be a penalty for not complying. This helps protect the club from difficult situations and gives contact information for emergencies. The requirements and penalties will be outlined in the contract form.

Your boat plans - If you are not going to need an SSC dock next summer, please let us know right away. If you are considering purchasing a new boat or selling your old one, let us know so we can anticipate your dockage requirements for next year. Just like on the starting line, we can't anticipate everyone's actions so giving us a heads up would be appreciated.

Dock availability - We currently will have 40' slips, 35' slips, 30' slips, and two 26' slips available for rent in 2026. Spread the word about how great SSC is in order to help fill those empty docks. Docks will be filled from the waiting list first so get your name on it for your best shot at a new dock.
