
2025 Dues Statements are in the process of being issued. Please keep an eye out for your statement and pay promptly with any generous contributions to the various SSC funds that you would care to support.

Boats in the basin for winter 2024/2025 - If you have been around SSC, you may have noticed we have boats bubbling in the basin. Sadler has purchased bubblers and plans to make this available annually for boats who want to stay in-water all winter.

New gate - Sadler worked with the SSC board and has placed an order for a new gate for 2024/2025. We are investigating going to a FOB system vs. a gate card.

Basin Depth Survey - Sadler has contracted and completed a depth survey for the entire basin, corner to corner. We will be posting the survey at the club for your viewing pleasure. We intend to start dredging as funds allow for areas we need deeper to match our plans.





Projects for the winter/spring 2025

- Fixing A dock's spud poles
- New 35' docks at the end of B dock
- New transient docks off the new wall thanks to a grant by PC Mike Fishbaugh and team. Eventually, we'll run power and water to these docks so they can be rented.
- New Pumpout We plan to re-submit the grant this fall.
 To do this, we need to dredge the area where the pumpout will be. (One of the reasons for the depth survey.)
 Our plan is to dredge just what we need so the pumpout can be done in 2026.

New 5-year plan for the basin - We hope to have a more comprehensive plan of what we hope to achieve in the next 5-10 years for further development of the basin. Primarily the west wall area to be used more for the invitational regattas which reduces the burden on our members.

Ice Boats on the Bay - If you have been down to the basin recently, you have noticed we do have ice this year for boating. We are looking to grow the membership of the SSC Ice Boat Fleet. We'd like to generate funds so we can keep our winter sport going for years to come. The fee is \$20. All are welcome.


