Message from Comm BlutarSKICommodore Andy Davis

I hope this early March finds you well and healthy, as we have much sailing to do this summer. Please take the time to review my comments below as there are some important data points everyone should be aware of.

Downtown Sandusky Master Plan - As the locals are likely aware, the City of Sandusky continues to invest in downtown and has developed a Master Plan which includes several significant strategic initiatives along the entire bayshore. There needs to be understanding that the board has, over the past several years, discussed our position within the community as well as the current lease in force between the City of Sandusky and Sandusky Sailing Club.

First and foremost, this lease is a legal binding agreement, and is very strong in terms of the mutual commitment between both parties. The point here is that our lease is in force for many years; therefore the city's plans for the future take our rightful lease and term into their plans.

Second, we have met with City Manager, Eric Wobser, Director of Community Development, Jonathan Holody, as well as the Manager of Battery Park to discuss our relationship moving forward. This discussion included, but was not limited to, signage and traffic flow within Battery Park, parking needs for larger events outside our domain,

and tree trimming/upkeep of the entry drive. I believe the conversation was grounded in partnership, and was very positive. Additionally, over the past several years, we have been in touch with members of the Steering Committee regarding the direction of the city in terms of investment and strategy.

Finally, we are, as time allows, attending the City meetings to ensure that we continue to understand timing of investment as well as any future impact to Battery Park, ensuring our rights continue to be protected. I am very confident the city sees SSC as an important partner regarding our most precious collective resource, Sandusky Bay and waterfront.

If you have concerns or questions, please feel free to join a Board Meeting and let's discuss it as this topic has been top of mind since I joined the board as a trustee in 2017, and was a discussion point prior to my joining SSC. It is also important to ensure that the Board speaks on behalf of SSC in this realm, so please be cognizant that our effectiveness will be negatively impacted by the "rumor mill" without an understanding of what we have been doing and planning over the past many years as well as current discussions.

I think this is a great time to leverage what the club offers to the city (Learn to Sail, significant regattas and commensurate income to the city from visitors, fundraisers which have a positive impact on local businesses, Adaptive Sailing, veterans' interaction and supporting their requests, Spring Break Simulator effort, iceboating, and being a good partner with the city). The time is now as we continue to emerge from 2020 to ensure our handprint is on the City of Sandusky. More to come on this.

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Spring Break support of local kids - This year it is on the calendar to host community children during their Spring Break - March 29-April 1, 10:00am-2pm. We need at least one (two would be ideal) instructor(s) daily to assist young sailors in the simulators. If anyone would be interested in volunteering to help us out during this event we would be most grateful. PC Matt and I are offering FREE pizza on a Fireside Friday to volunteers agreeing to help. We will teach them how to operate the simulators. We need to have people committed within the next week so we can move forward with planning and training. COVID - First, I want to take a few minutes to address a key topic that needs to be reiterated - not to frustrate folks - but to ensure we, as a responsible club, keep a sharp eye on this very key topic. It is very important to realize the understanding, effort and work put forth to continue to interpret the guidance provided by Health Officials, our Ohio Government, Liquor Control Board, etc. It really is a moving target, BUT one we take VERY SERIOUSLY. That said, I want to reiterate some key steps we all need to adhere to in order to keep the doors of the club open for those who wish to partake in any scheduled events.

1. As per the State of Ohio mandate, at any bar/restaurant you must wear a face mask when standing or walking within the confines of the establishment. Masks may be removed when seated (consuming a beverage, etc), but when the patron is going to stand up, a mask must be put back on.

2. Early during COVID, the Health Department paid a visit and we drew out table placements within the building and those were approved. It is important to keep those tables 6' apart to help maintain social distancing.

3. While our limit is approx. 420 people per the occupancy license, we now have notices determining no more than 100 may be in the building at any time, less than the 25% occupancy requested by the State of Ohio.

4. We have placed hand sanitizer around the club. Please feel free to use it. Additionally, we have changed the hand soap in the bathrooms to a highly anti-bacterial soap. Our contracted cleaning team member is sanitizing tables and the like when she is at the club. I would like to ask club members to please take a moment and wipe down your table when done. I will confirm there is the appropriate cleaning solution available. This is great for the next person who sits down.

5. The State of Ohio is now allowing “buffet style” dining, which requires utilizing hand sanitizer prior to getting your food, as well as moving in one direction while serving yourself. There are arrows on the floor. We are evaluating our buffet approach. There will be more info coming soon.

PLEASE help us ensure that we are following the rules within the club. It is so important not only for you, but equally as important for everyone else. I wanted to get this out there as I am sure some folks are not yet comfortable coming down to the club until it is more “open air.” I do appreciate that. BUT rest assured, we are very conscientious as to the safety aspect of the club, and look forward to seeing you when you are comfortable. Thank you all.

Senior Membership status - Just as a reminder of the Senior Dues/Membership criteria, as there have been questions around this topic. In the SSC Bylaws, there is a section around Senior Dues Status. In summary it states the following:

1. A regular member who meets the following criteria shall qualify for Senior Member Status.
 - a. A member must be sixty-five (65) years of age and be a Regular Member in Good Standing for a period of ten (10) consecutive years, as of the beginning of an annual dues period in question.
 - b. Consecutive Years of membership shall be determined with reference of “Year Joined,” Consecutive meaning: following one after the other in order or without interruption.

2. Once the criteria has been met in the current year, the member should email the Board in writing (or provide a written request) for approval of their Senior Membership Status, prior to December 1st of the current year. The Board will confirm qualification prior to the December Board Meeting (Budget Meeting), and at that point the dues will be subject to the discounted rate starting in the following year’s Annual Dues cycle.

3. If the December 1st deadline is missed, the member may request Senior Membership Status by December 1st of the following year. The December Board Meeting is the only meeting where Senior Membership Status will be approved for the following year's dues cycle.

4. Senior Membership Status is permanent as long as the member stays in Good Standing. If a member not in Good Standing is reinstated without paying missed dues to be considered current, they will be reinstated as a Regular Member.

5. Examples:

a. Member A turned 65 in 2021 and has been a member in good standing for 12 years. Member A will need to send a request for Senior Membership Status to the Board by December 1, 2021 for approval at the December 2021 Board Meeting. For the 2022 Dues Cycle, Member A will be considered a Senior Member.

b. Member B turns 65 in 2022 and has been a member in good standing for 20 years. Member B will need to send a request for Senior Membership Status to the Board by December 1, 2022 for approval at the December 2022 Board Meeting. For the 2023 Dues Cycle, Member B will be considered a Senior Member.

c. Member C turns 65 in 2021 and has been a member in good standing for 9 years. Member C will need to send a request for Senior Membership Status to the Board by December 1, 2022 for approval at the December 2022 Board Meeting. For the 2023 Dues Cycle, Member C will be considered a Senior Member.

Membership - This is the cornerstone of a healthy club. We have continued to grow over the past few years... a great sign of things to come. We grow because of the members we have, everyone's willingness to jump in and help, and the kind interactions we have with each other. I ask each and every one of you to consider this request... Please do your best to bring a new member into the club. Regular, Crew, Junior...any member is beneficial and broadens the reach of the club. I am respectfully asking for everyone's support in achieving this goal.

Here's our Spring Worklist.

Escort I (our workhorse last summer)

- Check bilge for rust, vacuum any debris, and evaluate interior barrier coat
- Clean, scrape, prime, repaint window gutters
- Bottom paint will need light sanding and painting when outside in Spring
- Check extinguishers and flares

PLEASE NOTE: Check your pockets, cases, if you operated **Escort I** last summer! Our primary ignition key is missing – we're using a backup key from key safe. This is a risky situation! If someone accidentally goes home with it in their pocket, we won't be able to operate.

Escort III (launching her as a supplemental boat this year)

- Finish install of cabin ceiling boards and dome light
- Re-install track for cockpit cover bolt rope (while inside)
- Check bilge for rust, vacuum, and evaluate barrier coat.
- Clean all interior surfaces
- Clean/scrape/sand/repaint window gutters
- Bottom paint pretty good – perhaps light sand and spot paint once outside
- ODNR Sticker expired

Grady-White

- Clean/wax hull
- Bottom paint waterline (outside)
- Clean interior
- ODNR Sticker expired

Tune-ups, etc. and mechanical stuff will be handled by Gary Thomas. Ryan Kyle has offered help with minor canvas repairs. The rest is up to you!
