Flying Scot Nationals – We will be hosting the Flying Scot Nationals this June 25-29 so mark your calendars and plan appropriately. We will need volunteers and there will be some disruption to the club. Watch for more details.

Search for a club secretary – We are in the market for a new secretary. Wes Blazer has put in his resignation as his business has taken some exciting turns and he no longer feels he can dedicate his extra time to this position. Here is the Constitution description of the duties of the Secretary:

I. SSC Constitution, Article VII, Section 2: The Secretary, although considered an Officer of the Club, shall have no voting power of the Trustees. The Secretary shall be appointed by the Board, shall hold office at the pleasure of the Board, and shall receive such compensation as the Board may prescribe.

II. SSC Constitution, Article VIII, Section 4.

The Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all transactions and proceedings of the members and the Board of Trustees, shall give notices required by law and all notices provided by the Code of Regulations or By-Laws of the Club, shall keep a proper Secretary's book, and shall properly record therein all minutes of members' and Trustees' meetings and other matters as shall be proper and necessary. The Secretary shall issue and attest to all certificates of membership and generally perform such duties as may be required by the members or Trustees, shall keep a true and correct roll of all members of said club, notify Officers of their election, as well as any members upon any appointment to any committee, shall keep a correct and up-to-date list of the names, boat ownership, and do and perform such other duties as may be necessary or incident to the Secretary's office. At the expiration of the Secretary's term, the Secretary shall deliver all books, records, papers and property of the club to the Commodore or to the succeeding Secretary.
